ACT

Formed in 1994 to provide grants to individuals and other charities with the aim of enhancing the quality of life for people in need, (specifically the mentally and physically disabled). Trustees meet four times a year.

ASSOCIATION FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF RUNNYMEDE (AIR)

AIR exists to help community groups and organisations obtain funding for environmental projects of all sorts, primarily through the Landfill Communities Fund, but also by other means where appropriate. Grants from a few hundred pounds to £50,000 are available for eligible projects. (Eligible projects include improvements to community and church halls, play area, parks and open spaces).

Criteria:

- Projects must be with the borough of Runnymede
- Projects must be available and accessible to the general public
- Projects must not be operated with a view to profit
- Projects cannot be funded retrospectively

THE SCHRODER CHARITY
